Migrant Child Care: Full day child care with educational and nutritional emphasis. Two meals and two snacks are provided. Parents must meet eligibility criteria:

- Parents are employed in agriculture related fields, in training or seeking employment.
- Income eligible: 50% or more of prior 12 months must be agriculturally related .

State Preschool: Half-day educational program with parental involvement & participation. Breakfast is provided for the morning sessions. A snack is provided for the afternoon session.
